What is the safest way to [pack a TV for moving?](#)

The safest way to pack a TV is using the original box with foam inserts, but if you don't have it, use a specialised TV moving box with protective wrap.

Unplug and clean your TV, remove the stand, wrap it in a microfiber cloth, then use [bubble wrap](#) or foam padding. Place it upright in a fitted box and secure it with packing tape.

Can I move a flat screen TV without the original box?

Yes, you can move a TV without the original box by using a dedicated TV moving kit or wrapping it securely in soft blankets with corner protectors.

- Use moving blankets or foam padding to protect edges.
- Secure tightly with stretch film or [packing tape](#).
- Place it upright between sturdy items inside the van.

How do I protect my TV screen during a move?

Cover the screen with a soft, non-abrasive cloth before wrapping it with foam or bubble wrap. Never apply tape directly on the screen.

Use corner protectors and avoid pressure against the screen. Placing cardboard or polystyrene across the front adds extra protection.

Should I lay my TV flat when moving it?

No, TVs should always be transported upright. Laying them flat can damage the internal components and screen structure.

Ensure it's upright and tightly secured to avoid shifting or tilting during the journey.

What kind of box should I use to move a TV?

Use a heavy-duty, adjustable TV moving box that fits the size of your TV and includes foam inserts or padding.

- Adjustable TV moving kits (for 32–70” screens)
- [Double-wall cardboard boxes](#) with corner protection
- Professional-grade crate if moving overseas

How do I secure cables and accessories when packing a TV?

Detach all cables, label them, and place them in a separate sealed bag. Attach it to the TV box or pack it with your electronics bag.

You can also tape the sealed bag to the inside of the box using masking tape for easy reassembly later.

Is bubble wrap safe for packing a TV?

Yes, bubble wrap is safe when used correctly — but it should not directly touch the screen. Always place a soft cloth first.

Use large-bubble wrap around the TV and smaller bubble wrap for cables and accessories. Combine with foam for extra safety.

How do I load a TV into a moving van securely?

Place the TV upright against a wall or mattress inside the van and strap it in securely to prevent shifting.

- Do not place heavy items on or around it.
- Use ratchet straps or bungee cords.
- Surround it with soft furniture like cushions or sofas for padding.
