2. What Types of Furniture Can Movers Take Apart?

5. How Long Does It Take for Movers to Take Apart Furniture?

Time depends on item complexity and access. On average:

- ?? Bed frame 15–30 minutes
- ? Wardrobe 30–45 minutes
- ?? Large sofa 30–60 minutes

More complex furniture may take longer.

6. Do Movers Bring Their Own Tools for Furniture Disassembly?

Yes. Our team arrives with all standard tools needed to dismantle and reassemble furniture efficiently.
