What Is Room-by-Room Packing?

- Leads to mixed item types in boxes (e.g. cookbooks with utensils)

What Is Category-Based Packing?

Packing by category involves collecting all items of the same type — such as books, clothing, electronics — from across your entire home and packing them together, regardless of the room they were in.

? Pros:

- Helps with decluttering and finding duplicates
- Great for minimalist or KonMari-style packing
- Makes organising your new space easier

? Cons:

- Slower and requires more planning
- Boxes are harder to allocate to specific rooms when unpacking

Which Packing Method Is Right for You?

Bathroom	Room-by-Room	Essentials kept together
